Dear Mr. Saliva:

In looking up the matter of the resolution passed by the National Council at its meeting of Dec. 9, 1931 granting me power of attorney to purchase two properties as I explained to you, it seems best to me to send you the copy of this resolution so that you may embody that in the form of power which you wish them to make in order to transfer the property. Please include the full resolution, that is the part covering the transfer of the property held by Bishop Ferrando under documento privado to which we will have to obtain dominion title, as well as the other property which may be already registered in title of dominion or possession composed of the two fincas Paraiso and Santa Rita as drawn up by you and told to me on Thursday of this week. I think it will be best to have the exact wording of the resolution embodied in the power when there will be no difficulty about the signature of the secretary.

Will you therefore please draw this up for me and send it to my office in San Juan so that it may go to New York on the ship leaving here on July 7th.

I am also enclosing the copy of the resolution passed by the Board of Trustees of the Church of Jesus granting full power and authority to Bishop Ferrando to negotiate with the Domestic & Foreign Missionary Society in regard to the transfer of the properties of the Church of Jesus in Porto Rico to the said Domestic & Foreign Missionary Society and to execute and sign all statements or other documents and agreements relating to this transaction. The said meeting was held on Dec. 7, 1931 in New York. I suppose therefore that the form for the power of attorney from Bishop Ferrando and the Church of Jesus should contain this resolution as also the description of the property.
