couragement and inspira-  
tion to me in my own  
small and somewhat iso-  
lated <sup>work</sup> which has been largely  
among the country people  
in the Bayamon District,  
and which has never been  
wholly successful on account  
of the lack of association  
with a Church organization.  
I am now living in the  
highlands, just on the edge

of a wonderful<sup>3</sup> stretch of  
country, where there is great  
need of such a work as  
that at Quebrada Simon.  
I would consider it a  
great favor if I could  
correspond with some  
one of your workers there  
who would give me more  
information about the  
work, particularly the  
schools. I am thinking  
of the possible solution  
of the problem of future  
training for girls under  
my charge.
