My dear Bishop:

I regret very much my misunderstanding about your trip to St. Thomas, I really understood that you were leaving Friday and were not to be expected until Monday, May 21. I naturally thought that for a trip like that you would spend some days. I intended to answer your letter of May 8th just today so that it would be at your office when you returned as I am under the impression your secretary is away.

I am very happy to have the Valentines here and so are all the people at Quebrada Limon, they have endeared themselves in such a way that all the people welcome them as old members of this staff. We have been very busy organizing the work, Mr. Valentine was installed as Director and General Manager of the Farm and the several appertainances of the Church his religious activities will follow, Mrs. Valentine as Director of all the Women's activities, Ruth Valentine as Secretary and Treasurer and I am happy to say that she has already been of valued assistance to me as my desk work was utterly neglected.

Now for the facility of the bookkeeping, if it is not too much trouble for you office, I beg you to order the money here, except personal checks which will run as heretofore, be sent in two separate checks, one to include all that belongs to the Farm for \$45.50 and anything other amount that might come for the Farm, and the other to include the following items:
